Helping Families Through "Food for Families"



"Food for Families" allows residents who live at Kerrybrook Apartments across the street from Colonial Hills Elementary, where we hold our weekly Kids Club, to receive a gift bag of food the week before Thanksgiving. Food for the 30 families who generally sign up totals approximately \$1200. Some students in Kids Club and Teen Time belong to these families. As a service project, Teen Time students pack the food and pray for the families before we begin delivering it door-to-door. Students pray with each family as food bags are given out. They ask for specific prayer requests from families

and offer them Bibles before leaving their apartments. We readily engage in sharing the gospel as the Lord provides opportunities with each family. This is a tangible way Teen Time students see God's provision for those in need: physical needs being met by other believers, and gratitude from those receiving the gifts given by people whom they don't even know. Going into the community physically, provides opportunities to engage in conversation, prayer, and personal evangelism that would otherwise not be possible. Please pray that we will have all funding needed to provide this valuable holiday giving experience to our teens and the families who receive this much appreciated provision.
