August 8-12, Stas, Aia and their team in Maxímovca, Moldova led a camp for children and teens. They had 75-80 in attendance each day and the largest number of teens to ever attend. One Way International was honored to partner with Stas and Aia financially to provide this camp. The Gospel was clearly given each day, and more than 100 parents attended the Friday evening festivities and heard the gospel as well. Aia wrote: "In all previous years, the older group was the smallest. This year it was quite the opposite. We think this is because those children who started coming to our camp in the younger group have grown up over the years and now make up the larger group. Some of them walked several kilometers every morning from a neighboring village. Several children came this week to their grandparents from Chisinau just to be in the camp. One girl from the older group is a refugee from Ukraine. Another girl from the middle group was from Ukraine. In total there were four children from Ukraine. They were very interested in the Bible lessons. They had very deep thoughts about who you can trust and that God is the one who will never let you down. We do not know if they would have had the opportunity to hear about these truths at home, but God provided for them. Their parents were also at the evening meeting. They were very grateful for the joy that was given to their children." Thank you for supporting our Moldova/Ukraine ministries. Moldovan partners continue to help Ukrainian refugees while keeping a close watch on what is happening on their border in case they need to find safety away from the war themselves.
